

ACACIA Reservation

Acacia Reservation, formerly a private country club and golf course, has undergone significant transformation to restore its natural beauty. Over 10,000 native plants and trees have been planted, eight acres of wetlands have been created, and work has been done to improve the health of Euclid Creek and its tributaries. Guests will enjoy exploring more than four miles of trails and seeing wildlife, including more than 100 bird species.



Hidden Gem


Explore the mostly flat, paved all purpose trail in Acacia Reservation as you witness the natural transformation of a golf course into a tranquil park. Discover birds, spring wildflowers and rolling landscapes in this quiet green oasis.



BEDFORD Reservation

Bedford Reservation's primary resource is Tinker's Creek and its 220-foot deep gorge, designated as a National Natural Landmark in 1968. A scenic parkway and all purpose trail traverse the park parallel to Tinker's Creek. With over a half-dozen waterfalls including the Great Falls of Tinker's Creek as well as nearly ten miles of mountain biking trails, the reservation is a popular destination for adventurers. New additions to the reservation include the 50-acre Dunham Park and 127-acre Astorhurst Park, the site of a former golf course. Bedford Reservation is linked directly to Cuyahoga Valley National Park and Summit Metro Parks through the Bike & Hike Trail.






Hidden Gem

Separated from the body of Bedford Reservation by a railroad, Viaduct Park is packed with interesting features. Industrial ruins, a century-old viaduct and an awe-inspiring waterfall make this a top spot to visit.




BIG CREEK Reservation

Big Creek Reservation serves primarily as an urban greenway, winding along Big Creek through the southwest suburbs of Cuyahoga County and connecting to Mill Stream Run Reservation via the all purpose trail. Several scenic picnic areas are found along Big Creek and the parkway. The highlight of the reservation is the Lake-to-Lake Trail, a 2.4-mile all purpose trail that connects Lake Abram to Lake Isaac and traverses the largest remaining wetland complex in the county. The new Engle Road Connector Trail offers a new alternative route to reach the midpoint of the otherwise linear Lake-to-Lake Trail.



Hidden Gem

Lake Isaac is a birding hot spot. This glacial pothole with splendid wildlife viewing is located along the Lake-to-Lake Trail. Relax by the lake or explore the connecting trail through wetlands and woodlands.

BRADLEY WOODS Reservation

Bradley Woods Reservation is filled with deep swamp forests, hiking trails and the quiet Bunn's Lake, a popular spot for viewing waterfowl. The park sits atop a massive formation of Berea sandstone that can still be seen in old quarry sites within the reservation. It is also one of the few remaining examples of swamp forest within Cuyahoga County, with large tracts of relatively undisturbed woodlands of pin oak, yellow birch, sour gum, red maple and tulip trees.






BRECKSVILLE Reservation

Brecksville Reservation is the largest of Cleveland Metroparks 18 reservations at over 4,200 acres. It offers a variety of recreational opportunities including 43 miles of diverse and scenic trails. The new Gorge Loop Trail provides first-time access down into the beautiful Chippewa Creek Gorge. The reservation also includes Sleepy Hollow and Seneca golf courses, Andrews Nature Play Area and the Valley Parkway Connector Trail – a critical link in the Emerald Necklace Trail. The historic Brecksville Nature Center, adjacent Trailside Program Center and three-acre tall grass prairie offer opportunities to learn and explore this rugged and scenic park.



Hidden Gem

Deer Lick Cave is a rock overhang, formed through erosion of Berea sandstone by water. It still holds salt from an ocean that covered Ohio millions of years ago. The salt attracts deer giving this beautiful geological site its name.



BROOKSIDE Reservation

Brookside Reservation is located along the Big Creek Valley and has remained a recreational hub in Cleveland for over a century. Ball fields, including the Jim Thome All-Star Complex, offer opportunities for football, soccer and baseball. The reservation's wooded hillsides, all purpose trail and stream corridor provide attractive spots for picnickers, walkers, cyclists and other guests. The new 25-acre Brighton Park features a scenic overlook of Big Creek as well as paved and natural surface trails that provide a critical connection to the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail. Brookside Reservation is also home to the nationally renowned Cleveland Metroparks Zoo.




CLEVELAND METROPARKS ZOO

Cleveland Metroparks Zoo is home to over 2,000 animals representing 321 species from six continents. The year-round Zoo features several unique destinations including African Savanna, Asian Highlands, Australian Adventure, Wilderness Trek and The RainForest, a unique, two-level indoor habitat featuring 600 animals and 10,000 plants from around the world. New adventures include The Daniel Maltz Rhino Reserve, home to the Zoo's herd of critically endangered Eastern black rhinoceros, and the Eagle Zip Adventure, a thrilling 700-foot zipline ride above Waterfowl Lake. Cleveland Metroparks Zoo hosts some of the largest, after-hours special events in Northeast Ohio, including Asian Lantern Festival and Wild Winter Lights.

EUCLID CREEK Reservation

Euclid Creek Reservation offers shady trails and picnic areas near the creek, surrounded by steep, forested hillsides and rocky cliffs. The lakefront portion of the park includes Wildwood, Villa Angela and Euclid Beach, offering boating access, picnicking, fishing, a large sandy beach and the script Cleveland sign for the public to enjoy. The Euclid Beach Pier pays homage to the former Euclid Beach Amusement Park and offers sweeping views of Lake Erie and the downtown city skyline.



Hidden Gem

Euclid Beach Pier offers one of Cleveland's best views of Lake Erie. As you take in the sun and waves, look up at the whimsical metalwork spanning the pier's arches, detailing the park's famous amusement park history.



GARFIELD PARK Reservation

Garfield Park Reservation's deep woodland valleys include scenic trails, picnic areas and a wetland. Four miles of all purpose trail traverse this historic park and include a popular loop and a connection to Mill Creek Falls, the county's tallest waterfall. Recent enhancements include restoration of the historic stone stairs, a new shelter and a nature play area. Improvements are underway to restore the historic pond, build a new program center and improve the health of streams and wetlands.



Hidden Gem

Take in the wonder of Cuyahoga County's tallest waterfall at the Mill Creek Falls overlook. At nearly 50 feet tall, the height and power of the falls is awe-inspiring in any season.



HINCKLEY Reservation

Hinckley Reservation features the 90-acre Hinckley Lake, enjoyed by anglers, paddle sport enthusiasts and visitors to the Spillway beach area. The Hinckley Lake Boathouse & Store offers kayaks, pontoons and stand up paddleboard rentals throughout the summer. Above the lake, the reservation features hiking and climbing opportunities at Whipp's Ledges and Worden's Ledges, the latter of which features unique carvings dating back to the 1940s. The reservation is nationally known for the annual return of the 'buzzards' every March 15th.



Hidden Gem

Hinckley Lake is Cleveland Metroparks largest inland lake, spanning 90-acres with opportunities for fishing, boating and hiking. The calm water and family-friendly offerings make for a perfect summer day trip.



HUNTINGTON Reservation

Huntington Reservation is located on the shores of Lake Erie and offers direct access to the lake for swimmers, paddlers, anglers and more. It is a hotspot for migratory birds in the spring and fall, especially water birds such as loons, grebes and mergansers. The Noshery and adjoining Sunset Picnic Plaza offer food and drink with striking lake views. The beach and surrounding forest provide a beautiful backdrop for sunset viewing or a summer hike. Three miles of nature trails pass through a variety of habitats ranging from forest, creek and meadow.





The Noshery and Sunset Picnic Plaza pay homage to Huntington Reservation's historic charm, offering new ways to take in spectacular views of Lake Erie. Made-to-order fare, drinks and ice cream make the concession area a summer highlight.



LAKEFRONT Reservation

Lakefront Reservation encompasses Edgewater Park, Wendy Park, East 55th Street Marina, East 72nd Fishing Area and the Gordon Park Boat Ramp. Stretching along Cleveland's north coast, Lakefront Reservation connects guests with the region's most valuable natural resource, Lake Erie. With the addition of several new trails and the Wendy Park Bridge, Lakefront Reservation now offers unprecedented access to Cleveland's waterfront. Beaches, marinas, boat docks, large green spaces, the Cleveland script sign and the Lindsey Family Play Space offer guests a variety of experiences along the shore. In addition to the lakefront, the reservation also includes park space along the Cuyahoga River with highlights like Merwin's Wharf in Rivergate Park and the eLCee2 Water Taxi that connects guests from the East and West Bank of the Flats. New day-use boat slips at Rivergate Park and Heritage Park offer recreational boaters opportunities to explore Cleveland's riverfront trails, restaurants and more.


OHIO & ERIE CANAL Reservation

The Ohio & Erie Canal Reservation lies within the Ohio & Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor with a unique blend of industrial valley and natural beauty. The reservation is a popular spot along the Towpath Trail that runs over 87-miles through the heart of Ohio up to Cleveland's lakefront. CanalWay Center, the reservation's educational visitor center, hosts dozens of free and low-cost nature and cultural history programs each month. Upcoming improvements include the expansion of its mountain bike trail and the addition of the bicycle pump track.



Hidden Gem

Marvel at the engineering genius of this wetland's resident beavers as you meander on the Blue Heron Boardwalk just down the hill from CanalWay Center.



ROCKY RIVER Reservation (North)

Rocky River Reservation follows the course of the Rocky River from Berea northward into Lakewood near Lake Erie. The character of the reservation is strongly influenced by the river, beloved by anglers for fly fishing and nationally known for steelhead trout. Massive shale cliffs rise above the willows, sycamores and cottonwoods, and many trails wind through the valley's deep floodplain forests, meadows and wetlands.





Hidden Gem

Immerse yourself in the sights and sounds of this gorgeous wetland by walking the shaded, paved all purpose trail dawdling in between tall grasses and the water's edge. Enjoy unobstructed wetland views of green frogs blubbing in the water and red-winged blackbirds cackling overhead.

ROCKY RIVER Reservation (South)

Guests seeking scenic views or a fitness challenge can explore the Fort Hill Stairs. Nearby enhancements including the West Channel Pond Loop and West Channel Pond Bridge connect guests with numerous bird species and wildlife, including the resident beavers. Rocky River Reservation is popular for maple sugaring in the spring and Rocky River Nature Center hosts many popular educational programs year-round.

Hidden Gem

West Channel Pond Loop Trail is the perfect place for wildlife viewing. With several rest areas, be sure to sit and relax on the recently constructed bridge, overlooking the pond. Herons, kingfishers, wood ducks, turtles and frogs are all regular visitors.

SOUTH CHAGRIN Reservation

South Chagrin Reservation, bordered on the eastern edge by the Chagrin River, is known for its unique rock formations, crystal clear streams and waterfalls. Unique soil supports the abundant growth of black birch throughout the forest. Rugged trails lead guests through hemlock forests, sandstone ledges, cold water creeks and ravines. Sites rich in history include Look About Lodge, Henry Church, Jr., Rock, Quarry Rock and the Polo Field.



Hidden Gem

Park at Sulphur Springs Picnic Area to access the Sulphur Springs Loop Trail, a 1 mile walk alongside babbling waters and serene forest. This coldwater habitat stream is home to a variety of fish and other aquatic wildlife, and offers scenic views of gradual, cascading waterfalls.

WASHINGTON Reservation

Washington Reservation includes a recreation field, picnic shelter, wetlands and an all purpose trail with neighborhood links. Washington Golf Course hosts the First Tee of Cleveland Golf Learning Center and is certified by Audubon International as a Gold Signature Sanctuary for environmental stewardship.



Hidden Gem

Washington Golf Course is the perfect place to learn and practice golf with a beautiful 9-hole, par 29 course and driving range. The course is conveniently located less than 10 minutes from downtown Cleveland.



WEST CREEK Reservation

West Creek Reservation connects the community to the scenic West Creek Valley, which harbors shale bluffs, forest-draped hillsides, and both natural and man-made wetlands that shelter a diverse variety of wildlife. The Watershed Stewardship Center promotes sustainable action and is a hub for the development, implementation and evaluation of best practices for urban habitat and watershed restoration. New additions include the Gorge Loop Trail, used for runners, hikers and mountain bikers, and the Skyline Overlook that provides views of downtown Cleveland.


