


Every gift you make is more than a donation; it is a promise that nature will thrive in Cleveland Metroparks for generations. Whether you support trails, habitats, education or a favorite reservation, you turn your care for the parks into lasting change.





This past year, your generosity shaped the experiences of millions who walk, learn, play and connect in Cleveland Metroparks. What follows is only a glimpse of what you made possible.







PROTECTING LAND, TRAILS & PUBLIC SPACES



In Brecksville, rehabilitation of the Hemlock Trail and new decking on the Deer Lick Loop Trail are renewing two of the reservation's most iconic paths. A new stone staircase at Hinckley's Whipps Ledges, wooden steps underway in Brookside and a rebuilt boardwalk in Bedford are refreshing these well-loved trails so they remain inviting destinations for years to come.



In Rocky River, portions of the Bridle Trail are being restored, while floating boardwalks at Beyer's Pond in Big Creek carry visitors into wetlands alive with nature. West Creek welcomed a new shared-use trail and mountain bike skills area.





Enhancements around the greenhouse in Acacia help safeguard native plants used to restore trails and natural areas throughout the Park District, while a refreshed observation deck in Rocky River provides a welcoming spot to pause and enjoy the view. A renewed overlook along the Towpath in Ohio & Erie Canal offers beautiful perspectives of the Cuyahoga River.



RESTORING HABITATS & ENHANCING ECOLOGY



Across the Emerald Necklace, over 3,000 trees were planted to strengthen our forests. Perennial plantings in Bedford and West Creek enriched entrances, while in Hinckley, flower beds at Ledge Lake and near the Boathouse were refreshed. New coniferous trees at Garfield's Windy Ridge and plantings around the Program Center further enriched the landscape. In Bradley Woods, donor support created new native gardens at the Codrington Shelterhouse, and in Huntington, trees are being replanted to replace some lost in last year's tornado.





From Whispering Woods in North Chagrin to Camp Corde in West Creek, to Scranton Flats and South Chagrin's Forest Loop Trail, new plantings and protections are strengthening habitats.





Donor funds also supported pest management to protect hemlocks, invasive plant cleanups and Blanding's turtle monitoring while helping advance shoreline restoration planning at the lakefront.

Alongside these ecological enhancements, your gifts also help fund land acquisitions, ensuring more natural areas will be protected and cared for far into the future.



CONNECTING YOUTH & COMMUNITIES



From the first steps in a career to the first steps on a trail, these opportunities were seeded by philanthropy. The Youth Outdoors Fellowship gave teens their first jobs, career coaching and mentorship - experiences that will guide them for years. You are also helping children experience Cleveland Metroparks through guided field trips that spark curiosity and inspire a lifelong connection to nature.





Outdoor classrooms at Nature Preschools in Garfield and North Chagrin are being refreshed with new equipment, and updates to Karen's Way Play Space in Huntington, the Andrews Nature Play Area in Brecksville and the Lindsey Family Play Space in Edgewater continue.

Donor generosity also strengthens community programming and outdoor recreation, from first fishing trips through the Youth Outdoors program to try-it sessions, group hikes and popular activities like urban line dance.





Momentum continues to build for the Patrick S. Parker Community Sailing Center, which will soon open Lake Erie to families across our region, and for Barge 225, a future floating education center at Wildwood Park that will bring Lake Erie's science, history and wonder to life for learners of all ages.



CREATING WELCOME SPACES & EXPERIENCES



In Brecksville Reservation, upgrades at Meadows and Plateau Shelters included improved picnic areas, water fountains and walkways. In Mill Stream Run, donor support enabled major improvements at Wallace Lake, making it a destination for families across the region. Your support also expanded opportunities in golf, from adding a new SoloRider accessible cart to reintroducing scholarships that help young players attend Junior Golf Camps and discover the joy of the game. And the purchase of a Freedom Chair, a trail-ready wheelchair, has opened access to paths that were once out of reach for visitors with mobility challenges.







Philanthropy also enhances the care and training of the animals who serve our community. Mounted Unit horses benefit from custom-fit saddles, ongoing chiropractic treatments and a new paddock that expands outdoor training space. Support also funded advanced officer training and helped welcome Blue, the newest member of the team. At the same time, each of our K-9s is equipped with a ballistic vest, giving these four-legged officers the protection they need to safeguard our community. With your support, both visitors and service animals continue to thrive in Cleveland Metroparks.







SUPPORTING WILDLIFE & AQUATIC HABITAT



With your support, wildlife across Cleveland Metroparks is thriving, and people are connecting to it in new ways. More than 200 upgraded cameras in the Focus on Wildlife project are capturing the hidden lives of local species, fueling nationally recognized conservation strategies. Your generosity also made possible the public release of our long-running breeding bird survey, ensuring this critical data is now available to researchers, educators and communities everywhere.

ENRICHING EDUCATION & GUEST EXPERIENCE



Across Cleveland Metroparks nature centers, your support is creating more welcoming and inspiring spaces. In Brecksville, perennial plantings near the center attract monarch caterpillars.



North Chagrin expanded its STEM learning capacity with digital microscopes, tactile animal pelts and child-friendly furniture, while its beekeeping program is thriving with new plants, hive care and bee suits for the keepers.

At Watershed Stewardship Center, your generosity is bringing an exhibit refresh to life and completing a new Creekside Classroom for younger learners.

At CanalWay, a new smart telescope is connecting groups to the wonders of the sky, even in the city. Each of these improvements is helping more people learn, discover and connect with nature.

At Rocky River, new reptile tanks, a nature play area and a larger-than-life wood duck sculpture create immersive experiences for children and families, while a new dipping deck at West Channel Pond offers exciting, hands-on nature exploration.
