





What People are Saying

- Overwhelmingly positive
- Tremendous support for trails and neighborhood connections
- Sailing and youth **boating** education was a priority for many folks
- Like ideas related to **placemaking** improvements such as seating nodes, themed play areas, swings, etc.
- Many advocated protection of birds and wildlife

- Multiple comments related to reducing lawn / adding habitat value
- Requests to continue and expand concessions
