Health Study

The World Health Organization defines **health** as a state of complete physical, mental, and social well being, and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity.



Parks contribute to:

- Social Health: Community, cohesion, sociality; observational studies from University of Washington
- Physical Health: improved fitness; correlations in the Netherlands
- Mental Health: decreased stress and anxiety; surveys from the U.K.

Cleveland Metroparks Recent Research

- Perceptions and preferences; 7 focus groups (70 individuals, 21-88 years old)
- Discovered gendered, generational, and geographic differences in preferences related to wilderness, perceived safety, and restoration
- Additional projects proposed including
 - Virtual / augmented reality
 - Youth obesity prevention
 - Forest bathing and mental health
 - Effectiveness of physician referrals for recreation



Zoo – Advanced Inquiry Program










Participation in Community Planning

Partnerships

 Strengthened partnerships to acquire lands and create new connections

L. A. N. D. STUDIO, INC. -----

- Since 2014:
 - Donated 3.8 acres
 - Facilitated the construction of the Cleveland Foundation Centennial Trail (CFCT)
 - Land valued at over \$2.5 million



WEST CREEK CONSERVANCY

- In 2006 acquired 279 acres creating West Creek Reservation
- Reservation has grown by nearly 100 acres
- West Creek Conservancy and the city of Parma have donated over \$6,500,000 in land
- Parmadale: Cleveland Metroparks contributed \$250,000 towards the \$1,750,000 acquisition of 78 acres










Partnerships

WESTERN RESERVE LAND CONSERVANCY

- Since 2013:
 - 132 acres
 - 17 acres of wetlands
 - 7,400 linear feet of headwater streams in the Chagrin River and the Cuyahoga River watersheds
 - Leveraged funds from Clean Ohio Conservation
 Program, WRRSP, LWCF, and the Conservation Fund





THE CONSERVATION FUND

- 2012:
 - Donated the Acacia Country Club
 - 155 acres valued at \$14.55 million
- 2017:
 - Donated an additional 0.9 acres
 - Awarded \$474,575 towards the acquisition of 102 acres












Historic US Coast Guard Station Renovations










Lakefront Activation

- Euclid Beach LIVE 2018 total estimated attendance was 20,150 guests, with an average weekly attendance of over 2,000 guests per event










CHAGRIN 2016: Shelter Reservations - Rocky River HINCKLEY 5 mile

Facilities Rentals – Geographic Distribution




