






Figure 1. Graph-comparing Edgewater and Euclid responses to "lakefront parks visited in the past 12 months"



A high percentage of respondents in both groups (65-75%) indicated that events, welcoming for all, and clean and safe are all things they feel the Metroparks does well.

What does Cleveland Metroparks DO WELL at the lakefront? (Select up to 4)


Figure 5. Graph comparing Edgewater and Euclid responses to "what does Cleveland Metroparks do well?" by percent



- There was an overall low response to this question (only 1/3 of respondents)
- Both locations indicated natural habitat, clean & safe, activities for kids, and recreation/ beach/ swimming could be improved (20-25%)
- More Euclid Beach respondents than Edgewater respondents indicated they felt educational programs, events, and welcoming for all could be improved





Lake Erie Water Trail – Cuyahoga County

A <u>water trail</u> is a recreational boating route along a waterway with strategically located access points similar to a hiking trail or bikeway.


- Internal team toured lakefront; work will continue in 2020
