#### **RELATIVE ABUNDANCE**

**C = Common**. Widespread and often numerous in proper habitat and season.

**O = Occasional**. Found at scattered locations or widespread but in moderate numbers.

**R = Rare.** Represented by a few individuals or has a very restricted range within Cleveland Metroparks.

**h = Hypothetical.** Occurrence within Cleveland Metroparks possible but not confirmed.

**X = Extirpated.** Once occurred, but is no longer found in Cleveland Metroparks.

\* = Exotic. Place of origin given.



Fishes are aquatic, cold-blooded vertebrates and include some 22,000 species. A person who studies fishes is called an *lchthyologist*. Many people are familiar with sport-fishes like perch and walleye, but there are many lesser-known species that inhabit the rivers and streams of Cleveland Metroparks. Fishes are good indicators of the health of our environment, and many have declined or disappeared with the pollution, sedimentation and channelization of our waterways.
