The information presented in this checklist reflects our current understanding of the butterflies found within Cleveland Metroparks. (This list includes all species that have been recorded in Cuyahoga County, and a few additional species that may occur here.) Record you observations and contact a naturalist if you find something that may be of interest.

Species are listed taxonomically, with a common name, a scientific name, a note about its relative abundance and flight period. Check off species that you identify within Cleveland Metroparks.

RELATIVE ABUNDANCE

C = Common. Widespread and often numerous in proper habitat and season.

O = **Occasional**. Found at scattered locations or widespread but in moderate numbers.

R = **Rare.** Represented by a few individuals or has a very restricted range within Cleveland Metroparks.

h = **Hypothetical.** Occurrence within Cleveland Metroparks possible but not confirmed.

X = Extirpated. Once occurred, but is no longer found in Cleveland Metroparks.

* = **Exotic.** Place of origin given.

NOTICE: Removing butterflies or any animal from Cleveland Metroparks is prohibited, except with a special permit for educational or scientific purposes.

- __*Orange Sulphur (Alfalfa) *Colias eurytheme* **C**; native to the western U.S.; Apr. Oct.

Special Note: Clouded sulphurs and orange sulphurs sometimes hybridize.

A Checklist of the Butterfies of Cleveland Metroparks



Butterflies are among our most colorful insects. Along with moths, they make up the order Lepidoptera, which means "scale-winged". Like all insects, they have six legs, three body parts and antennae. Butterflies go through complete metamorphosis. The larvae or "caterpillars" feed on specific plants until they pupate and transform into adults.
