



Overview

- Initiated in Fall 2005 to provide the public with timely fishing information
- Consistently updated weekly (Thursdays) September-May, and monthly June-August
- Has switched platforms 3x over those years, but now resides as part of the Cleveland Metroparks website
- Basic format is a text report followed by photographs, with various links throughout



Benefit: Serves Many People



Mike, not sure how extensive the report was on Beyer's Pond that you received but I have to say that place took a real big hit this winter. The wife and I stopped by and counted over a 80 channel cats, two real nice large mouths with about 4 smaller ones, a real nice crappie and all kinds of little fish. Pretty sure I saw the 3 Fish Ohio Channels I caught last August/September as well. So I spent about an hour casting my sonar phone covering as much of the pond as possible and could not find even one live fish.

Rain, snow?! Steelhead Spring

Unfortunately this week's rain took both the Chagrin and Grand Rivers back up to high and muddy. Last weekend several anglers reported good fishing in the Chagrin River, and fish were reported caught in Big Creek, Paine Creek and even one report out of Mill Creek at Hogback Ridge. Early in the week the Grand River started to look very promising, and then the rains hit and the level headed back up. Keep an eye on the levels through the weekend as the Chagrin is headed back down and could become fishable dependent on the amount of precipitation. Reports have come in that the creeks are fishable, however we aren't seeing a large amount of activity yet

Many have commented on the smaller size of the Steelhead lately, so when I saw this interesting information on the Cleveland Metroparks Fishing Report, I got permission to copy it and pass it on.

From the desk of Phil Hillman, Onio Division or Wildlife Fisheries Supervisor, District 3: "Anglers should be expecting plenty of steelhead in two length groups this Spring: 16-18" fish as well as 24-26" fish. The reasoning for this is that the last
