### ADDED VALUE FOR CLEVELAND METROPARKS VOLUNTEERS \$2,865,290

Independent Sector is the only national membership organization that brings together a diverse set of nonprofits, foundations, and corporations to advance the common good. The value of volunteer time is based on the hourly earnings (based on yearly earnings provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics) for the national average. Independent Sector indexes this figure to determine state values and increases it by 12 percent to estimate for fringe benefits.

Also included is volunteer travel time, whereas we calculate only time spent volunteering.
